



How To Set Up A Project

1. First, choose to do a project
2. Then, decide if you want to join an existing relationship or create a new one

Existing Relationships –These are the most simple and easiest to participate in. You simply join us as we deepen our existing relationships. You simply check the monthly schedule and bring your group along. Examples include street cleanups, feeding the homeless and serving our local associations on a monthly/ regular basis.
